Transition Belper have announced plans to hold a free two day event on the 1st and 2nd of June at the Belper Rugby Club grounds on Derby Road. The 'Belper Goes Green Weekend' will feature entertainment from local musicians, dance troupes, poets and other performers. Real ales will be available in the clubhouse and local groups and charities are being asked to put on local, healthy hot and cold food and non-alcoholic drinks. We hope to have other food stalls from local farmers and food providers.

We'll also have areas dedicated to home energy, art from recycling, local makers and artists, gardens and veg growing, bikes and transport, campaigners, kids fun, wildlife, heritage and a look at what Belper and the DE56 area might look like in 20 years' time.

We are not aiming to make a profit from the event so admission will be free of charge. There will be a small charge to business stallholders who are selling goods or services to help us cover the costs of setting up and running the event. We'd like to hear from:

- \* Performers who would like to entertain at the event
- \* Local non-profit groups who would like to prepare and sell local food
- \* Chefs who could provide demonstrations of creative ways of making meals with leftovers
- \* Local farmers, food producers, artists, makers, shops and businesses who would like to book a stall
- \* Anyone who can lead children's activities or offer face painting or hair braiding and is suitably vetted
- \* Craftspeople who can demonstrate traditional crafts and perhaps lead interactive sessions
- \* Anyone else with any ideas to make the event even better
- \* Sponsors who can help with the costs of marquees or a display trailer
- \* Buttons, bottle tops and corks please save them up and bring to a meeting or Green Drinks or contact David and Lynne.

So far we are making good progress in setting up varied and interesting food, home energy, recycling, arts and crafts and health and wellbeing zones and putting together the entertainment line-up. We're looking at activities and as much interaction as possible including clothes swap sessions, making mosaics and other art from waste and cycle maintenance and skills. A couple of specific ideas need people to run them:

- \* Plant swap sessions much like the clothes swap but for plants. It would need supervision on both days and organising promises of plants in advance so that we have a starting point.
